An introduction to Mayday Trust

Mayday Trust was first registered as a charity in 1979

The seed was sown in 1976 after Probation Officer Michael Varah and Probation Volunteer Jim Higgins spotted a link between re-offending and homelessness. Soon after, they founded their first 'hostel' in Rugby

Mayday provides specialised support, accommodation and life-skills training for vulnerable adults

Our clients include young people leaving care, victims of abuse, those with moderate learning difficulties and recurring mental health problems, ex-offenders and those with a history of substance misuse
